## Class Blazer





In topic, Blazer's KS3 class investigated earning a living for geography. They thought about jobs they may want to do when older and then looked at employment in the UK. They explored the different job sectors and identified examples. Students then looked at how the structure of employment has changed in the UK over time and how it compares to other countries. The class enjoyed a trip to the Black Country Living Museum to identify different job sectors. Dan enjoyed going down the mine which he identified as primary sector!

In science, Blazer's KS2 student explored forces and magnets and then health and movement. Ethan enjoyed looking at how magnets work and identified magnetic and non-magnetic items around school. In health and movement, he identified different food groups and then took a trip to Dudley Zoo to compare the diets of different animals compared to humans.

Blazer's KS3 students explored food in French. They learned what various different foods were in French and where they would go out to eat. They then were able to describe why they like certain foods. Isabel enjoyed going out for a hot dog as she was able to write and pronounce it in French.



### Class Henson



Class Henson have really settled in their classroom and with their class peers. Every morning they are excited for the morning songs and stories o start the day. All the children enjoy the tuff tray that is set up and changed daily with different activities to help develop their motor skills.

In English the pupils have been working on expanding their phonics knowledge. Pupils have engaged with the class reads and all have developed their awareness of the sequence of stories. The most recent class read is "The Jolly Christmas Postman" – all the children have enjoyed the work around the story.

In science, pupils have been expanding their knowledge of different materials. They have grown in confidence when identifying the properties of materials and enjoyed visiting a variety of places to explore materials.
